Sir,

Referring to your Land Return for April last, I have to inform you that Sale 264, covering S. 1/4 S. 1/4 Sec. 13, and Sale 265, covering S. 1/4 Sec. 14, both in Tennesfater, have been found satisfactory, and ~~entered~~ entered in the Books of the Department.

Sale 266, however, in the name of John Brownley, of lands in Tupper and Archibald, cannot be entered as reported in your Return. It will, therefore be necessary to forward a special Return for April, giving the lands covered by this Sale, in detail. I may also say that no Sale can be entered in the name of Mr. Brownley, for the lands purchased by him, until complete Returns have been received covering his purchase under the special arrangements made, and the full amount of the purchase, viz: - \$9,200.00, shall have been received by the Department, as you were advised in letters of the 21st January and 24th April last.

Referring to the sum deposited for examination and valuation fees, which you state was \$500.00, I have to direct your attention to <sup>paragraph</sup> ~~Section 9~~ of letter to you of the 20th May, 1902, in which it is stated "the purchaser to pay cost of valuation for the lands found to be unfit for settlement".
