It has been the policy of the Bn that any men who have been badly shaken up in their companies be sent back to the Bn where there is more quiet in order that they may have a rest. During this period they act as guards around the Bn.

The accused who was a "C" Coy runner, having had a shock the day before, was sent back to recuperate. He was still in a shaky condition when put on guard.

The accused has been in the army about 11 months, and during his training has never received training in the duties of a guard, and when he arrived at the unit there was quite an emergency present, and the Regiment took him as a trained soldier, and did NOT instruct him in his duties as sentry, although he received instruction on the duty of his post. His early training in Canada was at fault at not having as he had not received instruction in guard & sentry duties.
