This Band in 1867 numbered 61 and in 1863 there are only 39 showing a decrease in quantity. Since there has been a gradual decrease - In a very few years on they will become extinct. I think for them the locale where they Lake being very marshy around its margin. I have repeatedly advised this people to remove cities to the Mud. & Rice Lake. I have they would be entitled to go, as they are considered by the Mud. & Rice Lake Bands a part of their Tribe. They however resist my advice.

Chief Junt bin a Dixon died about a year ago, and within 3 months of each other of consumption. As in 1857 he left them in 1863. they have neither a Missionary or school, and there numbers are few that none of the religious teachers can afford to provide either.
