

tify such Institution of the nature of the defects mentioned in the report. Should then such Institution fail to remedy such defects within a reasonable delay the Board might, upon a vote of two thirds of the members present, decide to not acknowledge its diplomas until it has removed such defects.

V. Any resolution of the Board to the effect of declining to acknowledge the degrees or diplomas of any University, College or Medical School, together with the reasons which have called for such action, shall be immediately communicated to that Institution.

VI. The assessors, shall within the eight days immediately following the examinations, send in a written report to the Secretary of the district wherein the examinations were held. They will be entitled to the reimbursement of their travelling expenses and to a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) per diem.

The assessors' fees shall be defrayed by the College, for the regular annual examinations only, of each Medical Faculty. Should a Faculty wish to retain the services of assessors for a supplementary examination, it shall deposit the amount of such assessors' fees, with the Secretary of its district.

VII. Each University, College or Medical School, shall give at least, one month's previous notice, of the date of its regular and supplementary examinations to the Secretary of its district, and the Secretary shall, in turn, be held to transmit such notice to the assessors appointed to visit such University, College, or School. The annual and regular examination of the Faculties shall not begin before the first week of June, and the supplementary examination not before the third week of September.
