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than that. We would suggest that in order to increase the sales from our Book Room a circular should be sent to all our Pastors and Sunday School Superintendents, calling attention to the fact that we are supplying Hymn Books and Libraries as cheaply as they can be obtained from any bookseller, and requesting their patronage, as a help to denominational objects.

It will now be the duty of the Company to elect a Board of Directors for the ensuing year, of "not less than three nor more than nine" members, from among those who are "not in arrear in respect of any call" upon them for the amount of stock held by them. The election must be by ballot, and may be for one, or two years, but not longer. It may also be desirable to appoint a Committee to draft a code of By-laws for the management of the affairs of the Company, to be submitted to an adjourned meeting.
