will go to further; to remit to the company one-half of the royalty they pay on that part of the coal to which that royalty applies; to engage to impose upon all other parties who may open coal mines, a burden equal to the royalty which your Majesty will have to pay; and will engage that no export duty shall be levied on coal.

Under the treasury minute of 1845, the royalty is payable on all coal that is raised over and above the 26,000 chaldrons to which the fixed rent applies.
