9. An enumerator refused to put on the list a naturalized alien who had been naturalized 48 years ago, and has been township clerk for 47 years, and has a son overseas, and on election day this man applied to vote on certificate, but was refused.

The refusal here is also wilful. See subsection H of section 67 of the Act, and also section 67B. The Deputy returning officer himself could have Put on such a person, and allowed him to vote, and in this instance, both the deputy and the enumerator are liable.

10. An enumerator put the names squaws on the list, but did not furnish list of same to the candidate or his agent. The enumerator took an active part in having these squaws vote and they did vote.

The enumerator's acts were certainly wilful and

he is liable.

The only power the enumerator had was to strike off names from the Provincial lists (in some of the provinces the list of 1916) the names of certain Germans and Austrians disqualified by the Dominion Act of 1917 and add the names of women entitled by said act to vote.
