The faid reprefentation and papers are as follows:

To the Honorable the Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes, affembled in Provincial Parli ment of Lower Canada.

The Commissioners appointed by His Excellency Sir ROBERT SHORE MILNES, Baronet, Lieutenant Governor of the Province, under an Act of the Provincial Parliament, intituled an Act for applying the sum of one thousand pounds out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of His Majesty's Receiver General, towards the improvement of the Inland Navigation of this Province.

HUMBLY REPRESENT,

That after visiting the Rapids of Saint Louis, commonly called the Rapids of La Chine, accompanied by the most experienced pilots and others, the best acquainted with the Navigation of the fame, and acquiring what other information they could, the better to enable them to carry the intentions of the Legislature into effect.

They Refolved to remove the rocks in the channel, commonly called the *Trois Roches*, to cut down the flatt, near the bottom of the raputis, commonly called the Gallots, to a level with the general depth of the water in the channel; and with a view of confining the water that was loft on the North fide of the channel, to build a wharf on that fide, but doubtful of the effect the wharf might have in deepening the water in the channel, or whether it would refift the ice, they only refolved to build three hundred feet in length, yet of fufficient confiftency to afcertain both points.

To give a fair competition to undertakers, they advertifed the work to be done, in the Montreal Gazette, and in the contiguous part of the Upper Province, and Mr. De Lorme being the lowest offer, they entered into the contract, a copy of which accompanies this.

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
