Frugality and Care to discharge the Annual Expense of Government.

Then the Houfe adjourn'd till Tomorrow Morning Ten o'Clock.

Thursday, November 9, 1769.

*Voted*, That the Sum of Six Pounds Eight Shillings be paid by the Treafurer of the Province, out of the Public Money in the Treafury, to Mr. *John Kent*, Meffenger and Door-keeper of this Houfe, for his Services to this Day inclusive, and Fuel fupplied.

His Majefty's Council returned the Bill to explain and amend Part of the Act for the Establishment of Fees; not agreed to.

A Meffage came from his Excellency the Governor, requiring the Attendance of the Houfe in the Council-Chamber, accordingly Mr. Speaker with the Houfe, went up to attend His Excellency, who was pleafed to give his Affent to the following Bills:

A Bill for eftablishing and regulating Ferries:

- A Bill in further Addition to an Act made in the 5th Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intitled, An Act for the raifing Money by Prefentment on the feveral Counties in this Province, for the defraying certain County Charges therein mentioned.
- A Bill to prevent, for a limited Time, the Exportation of Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, and Peafe from this Province.
- A Bill in further Amendment of an Act made in the 6th Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intitled, An Act concerning Bail.
- A Bill in further Addition to and Amendment of an Act made in the 33d Year of His late Majefty's
