His Majesty's Council returned the Bill to explain and amend Part of the *Act for the Establishment of Fees*; not agreed to.

A Bill for establishing and regulating Ferries:

A Bill in further Addition to an Act made in the 5th Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act for the raising Money by Presentment on the several Counties in this Province, for the defraying certain County Charges therein mentioned.*

A Bill to prevent, for a limited Time, the Exportation of Wheat, Rye, Barley, Flour, Meal, and Pease from this Province.

A Bill in further Amendment of an Act made in the 6th Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act concerning Bail.*

A Bill in further Addition to and Amendment of an Act made in the 33d Year of His late Majesty's
