

The man who thinks he has the loneliest job in all the war was recently on leave in London. There he was spending all his waking hours walking the streets and looking at the crowds. Three years ago he was a cog in London's commercial machine. Then he went to Gallipoli. Now he is attached to the Soudanese army near the Abyssinian and Belgian-Congo frontiers. He is the only Englishman in an area of 200 miles and none of the native troops in his command speak English. He has a smattering of Arabic and his only conversation is in that language. Some of his men, who, he says are line soldiers, were enemies not many years ago. In an interview reported by the Manchester Guardian he remarked that the very sight of crowds was a luxury after his experience. His chief diversion in Africa is playing, "Patience," although this is dicersified by incidental lion hunting and the casual chance of shooting other big game.
