Curious Bits of News.

The present mace of the British House of Commons has been in use since the reign of Charles II. It has accordingly witnessed the rise and development of constitutional principles and practice, and of the responsibility of Ministers of the Crown to the House of Co mons, and through the House of Commons to the people at large.

A little machine which threads one thousand needles a minute is at work in St. Gall, Switzerland. It takes the needle from a hopper, carries it along and threads it, ties the knot, cuts the thread off a uniform length, then carries the needle across an open space and sticks it in a rack. The work of threading these needles was formerly done by hand.

The highest waterfall in the world, geography tells us, is the Cerosola cascade, in the Alps, having a fall of 2,400 feet; that of Arvey, in Savoy, is 1,100 feet, and the falls of the Yosemite Valley range from 700 to 1,000 feet.
