Under the heading of "Transportation" a number of important resolutions were adopted. One recommended a reduction in minimum car loads from twenty thou nd pounds to seventeen thousand pounds for large express refrigerators and fifteen thousand pounds for the smaller cars on both domestic and export traffic. Another called attention to the fact that protective service was being granted on all railway lines west of the great lakes covering ship-ments from British Columbia, and recom-

mended the extention of the service to and from all points in Canada at a reason charge which would be calculated on the cost of the insurance service.

One of these resolutions stressed the necessity for wider distribution of Can-adian fruits, and called upon the carrying companies to establish express carload commodity rates from producing centres to distributing points in local territory and from British Columbia and Ontario points to various points in the United States.
