**VIENNA, July 28.**—A cyclone in Hungary, Transylvania and Bukovina today swept over several thousand square miles of territory. Hundreds of persons were killed, crops destroyed and enormous damage done to houses and churches. The city of Crossow in Zepelin and Mohacs were completely ravaged.

**PITTSBURGH, July 24.**—Within the last few days, the suggestion of Leach, mayor of the port of Philadelphia, the Pittsburgh appraisers have decided to admit English wool at 10 cents a pound instead of 30 or 40, according to classification, as heretofore. This will make the English wool cheaper than the American article. There is a fear that the wool industry will be ruined.

**LONDON, July 24.**—At today's session of the Parnell Committee, Molony, an ex-official of the Land League, was examined. He denied all knowledge of any documents concerning the League, except those which were in the hands of George Lewis, Parnell's solicitor. Molony also said Parnell was in error when he stated that he (Molony) upon leaving the country ordered that documents in his possession should be destroyed.

**WINSTON, Ont., July 26.**—Some time ago some vandals set fire to the gas well at Rutheven, which has a flow of 10,000,000 feet per day, and up to today nobody has been able to approach within 200 feet of the well. Today C. H. Marvin clothed himself in asbestos and performed such work at the mouth of the well as will enable the owners to extinguish the fire. He received \$1,000 for the job.

**SEABOARD, July 26.**—The yellow river has again burst its banks in Seaboard, inundating an immense extent of country. There is 12 feet of water throughout 10 large Governmental districts. The loss of life and property is immense. The Government authorities at Pekin are dismayed. Owing to the incapacity of the local authorities foreign engineering aid, in order to permanently repair the channel of the river is considered imperative.

**PARKERSBURG, W. Va., July 26.**—A courier from the flooded district brings news of disaster. He says the river rose 32 feet in four hours, flooded country and carrying off stores, houses, churches, fences and crops and tearing up trees by the roots. From Barnesville down to the mouth of the river destruction is complete, nothing can be heard from the country along the upper waters on the river. There is an immense drift pile, over a mile long, full of houses and the bodies of sheep, horses and cattle. Twenty-five bodies have been identified and aid is being sent for people who are destitute.

It is announced in Quebec that four hundred thousand pounds sterling have been subscribed in England for the construction of the cable which is to run from the Strait of Belle Isle to a point on the west coast of Ireland. The Dominion Government will, it is believed, continue the land line along the north shore of the St. Lawrence to the Strait of Belle Isle, where it will connect with the new cable. This line will be taken on a long lease if possible by the cable company. The object is to give to Canada an independent Atlantic cable and the government is understood to be encouraging the construction in every possible way.

**MARION CITY, Iowa, July 27.**—On Wednesday night in Elk township, Marion county, Wesley Elkins, only a little more than 11 years of age, murdered his father and his step-mother. After committing the crimes he took his infant sister in a carriage and drove four miles to the nearest neighbor and reported that he had discovered his parents murdered and fled to save his own life. He had some difficulty with his father and shot him while he slept. His mother he says, he dispatched with a club. He then took the baby from the bed where it had lain between its mother, who had just moved its disordered clothing, and went to the neighbors as above stated.
