### DARING BURGLARY

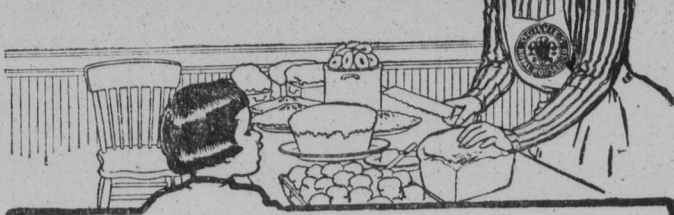

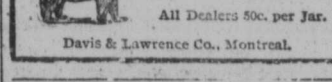
