In this connection, also good supply of water should be installed on the South Side, for the use of citizens residing there. It will be my duty to see that these matters are accomplished and as speedily and as economically as possible. I shall also devote my efforts to improve the sanitary affairs of the city, the installation of a sewerage system which will not bear heavily upon individual citizens, but which will meet the needs of the city generally, the substitution of the concrete drains for the disease spreading cobble stones at present in use, with constant and regular flushing, and the extending


