4780 Pupils Now Attend the London Separate Schools

Forty-Sixth Annual Report Issued by Board of Management—Facts and Figures.

The 46th annual report of the Catholic School Board of London has just been issued, and it contains many facts and figures relative to the separate schools of this city, which are of general interest.

According to the report there were in 1903, 875 Catholic families in London with a total population of 4,287, as follows:

Wards: St. Paul, St. Lawrence, North, South, and West.

Families: Population.

No. 1 166 726

No. 2 233 1,357

No. 3 216 916

No. 4 200 1,258

Total 875 4,287

The 58 families with 241 of a population of 1,241, are included in Nos. 1 and 2 wards respectively. As the total population of the city is something over 40,000, the Catholic population is thus shown to be in the ratio of about 1 to 5.

In the separate schools of the city there are 19 teachers, and 780 pupils—445 boys and 335 girls. The total average attendance is shown to have been during 1903, 623 pupils. The aggregate attendance in days reaches 122,903 during the year. In 1902 there were 784 pupils on the rolls, with an average attendance of 627.

In St. Peter's school there were 6 teachers and 268 scholars; St. Mary's, 4 teachers and 137 scholars; Sacred Heart, 4 teachers and 88 scholars; St. Nicholas, 2 teachers and 70 scholars; St. Martin's, 2 teachers and 52 scholars; St. John's, 1 teacher and 61 scholars; St. Joseph's, 1 teacher and 58 scholars.

FINANCIAL CONDITION GOOD.

The receipts for last year totaled \$12,168. In addition, the school board received from the city of \$7,866.35; from the township of London, of \$134.48; from the township of Westminster of \$56.83; the legislative grant of \$822 and \$3,000 cash borrowed to build St. John's school. The disbursements totaled \$11,700.07, leaving a balance of \$468.38.

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
