PRISONERS GET ADDITIONAL TERM

Five Inmates of the Ontario Reformatory Sentenced For Making Recent Escape.

Guelph, Jan. 23.—Five inmates of the Ontario reformatory, who made a break from that institution a week ago, were given additional prison sentences when they appeared before Magistrate Watt this morning on charges of escaping from custody. James Barringer, of Cornwall, who got away last July and was not caught for some time, received an additional year to his present sentence.
John Gallow, Hamilton; Harry Harding, St. Catharines; Gerald Burke, Toronto, and Frank Turner, of Chatham, were the quartet who were caught within an hour of their escape a week ago, two other prisoners getting safely away.
Gallow and Harding got off with an additional year on account of their youth. Burke and Turner were each given two years in Kingston reformatory.

OXFORD COUNTY HOME DAMAGED BY FIRE

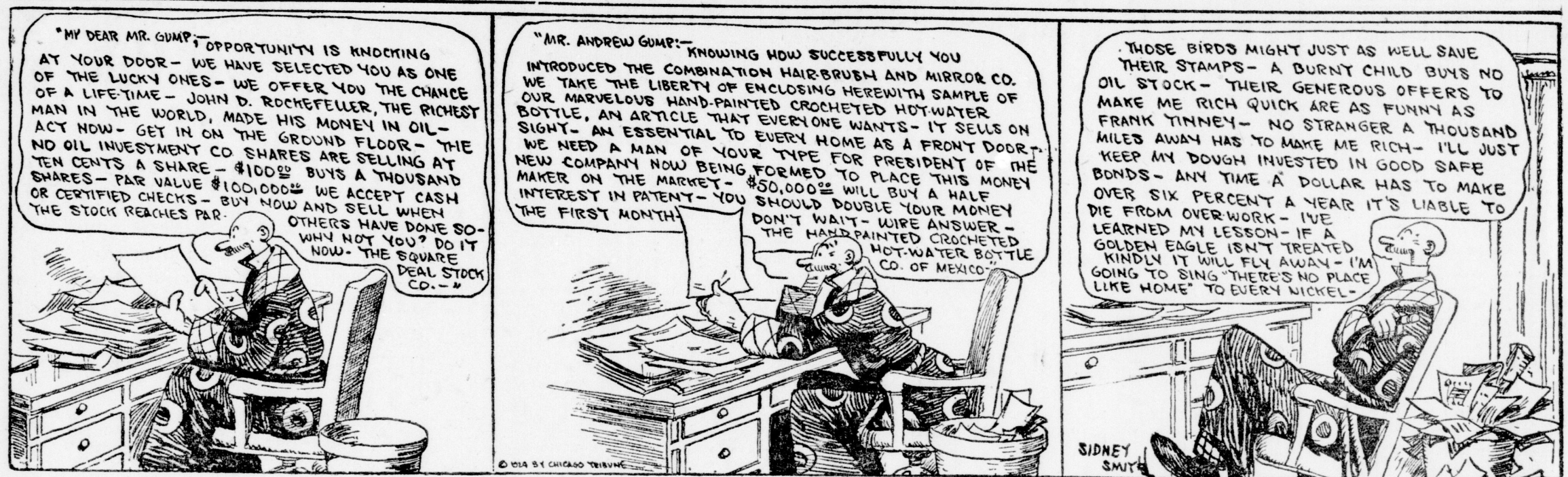
Canadian Press Despatch.

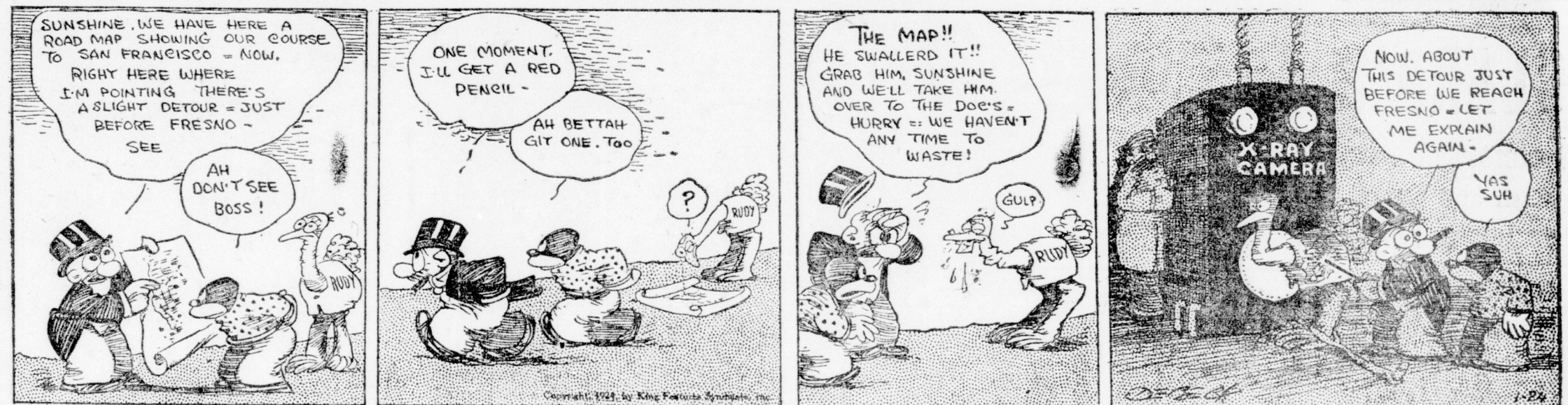

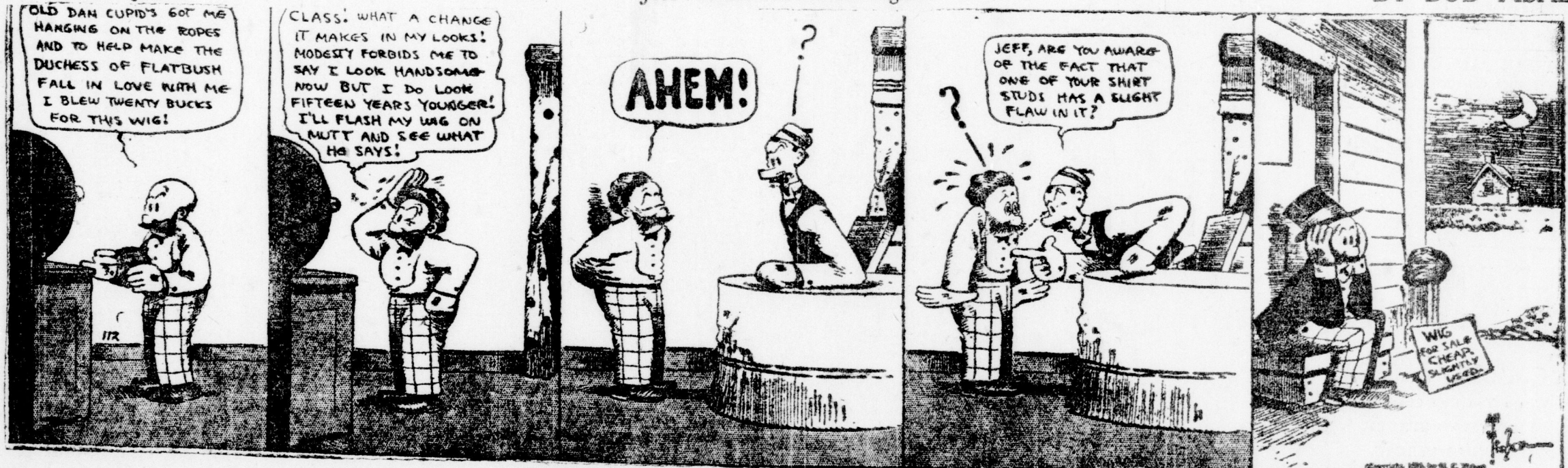
