A Terrible Struggle for Life—Two of the Crew Washed Overboard.

San Francisco, March 31.—Capt. John Dawson gave to day a detailed report of the wreck of the bark Archer, the loss of carpenter Andrew Anderson and an able seaman A. E. Evans, and the terrible battle for life the crew had when they were attempting to leave the capsized bark to reach the life boat.

"We left Victoria for Portland, Oregon, on March 16," said he, "but had to put into Port Angeles through stress of weather. On the 17th we started again. At 1 p.m. we were off Cape Flattery, where a heavy snow storm set in, and the wind continued to blow from the S.E. We set the lower top sails and lower stayualle and stood to northward.
