New York, July 28.—Today's stock market turned to a large extent on the Anglo-Russian relations, and was a striking demonstration of how large an influence the same cause had in yesterday's market. Not only securities, but also all other speculative markets responded promptly to the brighter outlook in the relations between the two powers.

Grain markets here relaxed in spite of some rumors of unfavorable development in the spring wheat region. Sterling exchange reacted decisively from the gold export point. Stocks in New York regained rather more than they lost yesterday.
