CAMPBELLTON,

PROVINCIAL BANK HAD GOOD YEAR

Increase in Deposits Shown During Past Year Valuable Assets in Treasury

The annual financial statement of the Provincial Bank of Canada, as on November 30, 1923, shows net capital of \$555,000 after making provisions for all bad or doubtful debts. This amount being for 17 months operations, it is at the rate of 12.75 per cent on the \$5,000,000 paid-up capital of the bank.

The net income now stands at \$1,000,000, or 50 per cent of the paid-up capital. The bank's assets now reach the figure of \$37,874,885, and its total obligations to the public, deposits, etc., are \$22,797,155.

A feature of this statement is the very large proportion in the bank's assets occupied by Government and Municipal securities, which amount in all to over \$5,100,000. Other liquid assets include the sum of \$4,550,000 in cash and in bank balances, \$4,247,000 in railway and other bonds, etc., and \$5,058,889 in call and short loans on bonds, debentures and stocks. In short the liquid assets, amounting to \$19,889,888, constitute, therefore, 52 per cent of the aggregate amount of all the obligations due to the public.

The deposits show an increase of \$3,709,000 at November 30 last, and the number of depositors has considerably increased. It is noticeable that according to regulations approved by the shareholders since the foundation of the bank, the Provincial Bank of Canada is making no loans to its directors. Another feature of the organization of the Provincial Bank of Canada consists of a Board of Control—"Commissioners-Censors"—for the saving department. This board is composed of three members elected from the shareholders at the annual meeting. Each month they make an examination of the assets of the bank, in order to ascertain the liquid assets are at least 50 per cent of the savings deposits, as shown on the last monthly report to the Federal Government.

WILL RETIRE SOON
The board of education has granted Dr. George A. Inch, for thirty years a member of the Provincial Normal School faculty and previously for 25 years engaged in the teaching profession in New Brunswick, a retiring allowance of \$700 annually to supplement the \$300 a year which he will receive as pension under the Teachers' Pensions Act. He is 75 years of age and will retire at the end of the present academic year in June.

IN THE LUMBER WOODS
The past month has been very favorable for work in the lumber woods and good progress has been made with the work. Most operators finished cutting operations some days ago and their crews are now busily engaged in hauling the logs to the mills. It is expected that the work will be pretty well advanced before the end of the present month. It is generally conceded that the present winter has been one of the most favorable for lumbering in a number of years.

ANNUAL MEETING OF LOUNSBURY CO.

Held at Newcastle—Large Attendance of Shareholders—Confidence in Future

The annual meeting of The Lounsbury Co., Limited, was held on February 6 at its head office, Newcastle, N. B., at which practically all the shareholders were present.

The dividend on preferred stock was paid as usual during the year, as well as 6 per cent on the common stock. After reading the report, the directors for the coming year were appointed as follows: W. G. Clark, President; C. C. Hayward, General Manager; Edward Hanney, J. H. Dunlop, H. E. Warman, F. E. Locke was again appointed secretary.

In reviewing the year's operations, which showed an improvement, Mr. Clark expressed confidence in the future and forecasted that the year 1924 would, without doubt, show even better results.

Representatives from the different branches held a conference during the evening, when encouraging reports were heard and a general feeling of confidence in the future expressed.
