THE FARMER'S ATTITUDE TO "WAR PRODUCTION"

From The Teller

Behind the agitation for increased food production on farms and vacant lots there is undeniably a good intention. It is far from everyone's mind to evoke hostility among the farming community. Yet there have been phases of the "War Production" campaign that have not been entirely just and fair to the farmer.

In legal phraseology he is beginning to give "tu quoque" to the city folk. In his own parlance he is turning round and saying "You're another!" In biblical language, he says in effect: "Take out the bean in your own eye."

And isn't he right? Can't he see the city folk better than we ourselves can judge them?

His plaint runs in this way: "Look at the great fleets of automobiles that line every street in the city! Are they for business, for speeding production? Or are they for pleasure? Study them closer—Monster cars that are gluttons for gasoline, tires, and oil. Winter and summer, in use or not, they must cost from \$15 to \$20 a week for upkeep. We on the farms count ourselves lucky if we own a Ford."

And then the farmer feels that in other ways city folk are not doing all they might to economize.

"You city folk," he says, "complain of the high cost of living. Yet you do nothing to keep down prices. Your table is still luxury-laden. Your appetite for good things is unabated. You still crowd your shows, you still enthuse over ball games, you still hunt the golfing greens."

"Surely before urging the farmers to put in many extra hours in seeding and other toil, you ought to set a better example in your own conduct. I agree, that greater production is necessary on the farms. But in urging it, in helping it along, you should set an inspiring example by economizing in the city."

"I turn to your city papers. I see page after page of liquor advertising. How many millions of bushels of grain are consumed in manufacture of this liquor each year? Is it fair that we should be asked to turn in more ground to enable you city folks to get liquor?"

To be sure, the farmer has a justifiable complaint. Let us get down and do some REAL economizing. Let us save until it hurts to save, until we really feel our sacrifice.
