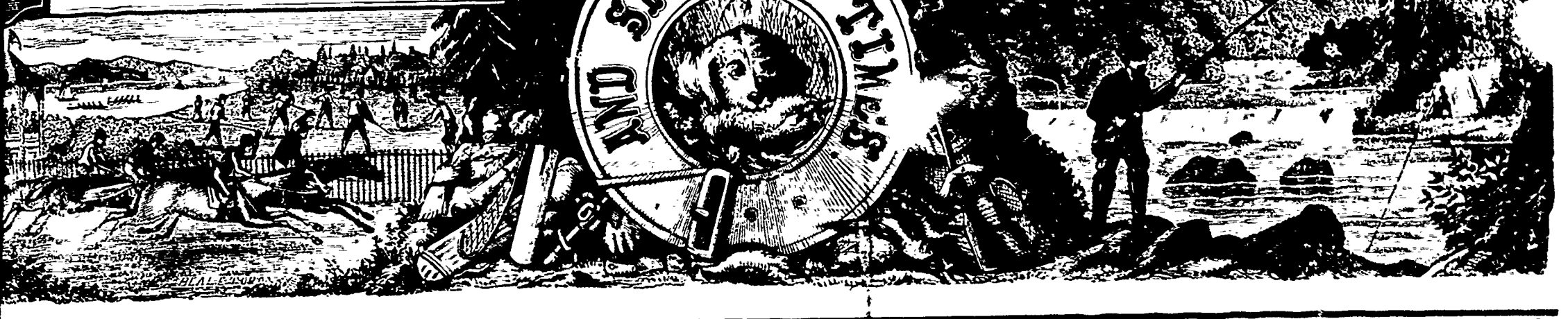

### SHOOTING AT STRATHROY.

The badge for the champion wing shot of Strathroy was lost by Mr. J. Paine at the last regular monthly club shoot, Mr. Isaac Thompson and Mr. Alex. Johnston tying for the honor. In the shoot-off Mr. Thompson won. Mr. Johnston then challenged him on the spot to shoot on Thursday last. The match came off, when they again tied, but in the shoot-off Mr. Johnston gained the badge. The number of birds shot at by each of the contestants at the two matches and shoots off was 25, each killing 20 out of the 25, and 5 birds that scored against them falling dead out of bounds. We call this good shooting. We understand Mr. L. H. Smith has challenged Mr. Johnston for the badge.

Two parties of sportsmen, numbering 20 each, left Ottawa on the 9th inst., to shoot small birds and squirrels. They met at the close of the day at Bell's Corners, and found that one party had slaughtered 360 head, and the other 230. lion, 154 hands, with whose breeding no fault can be found, being sired by Gage's Logan, he by Ryedyk's Hambletonian; dam by Florizel, and granddam by Geo. M. Patchen. The mare Em is a gamey little bay of 15 hands, sired by Wild Bashaw, and was brought here from Iowa, about two years ago, since which time she has become quite famous in a local way for her well known qualities of pluck and endurance.

The stallion is the property of Messrs. Mordock & Struble; the mare is owned by P. L. Kimborty, Esq., and as each of these parties are gentlemen who, besides being genuine lovers of horseflesh, are always ready to lay upon the merits of their favorite, much interest has centered in the race, the pros and cons have been freely discussed, and many a dollar has been laid upon it since the day the match was made. Though both horses were previously in fair shape, practically only thirty days were given to the grand preparation, and we hardly expected, therefore, to see the animals come to the post in as good condition as they did. Kirkman drew a 100 lb. wagon, and the mare was hitched to one weighing 24 lbs. less. The day was very warm, the thermometer standing at 90 degrees. The track, a half-mile one, was much worn and dusty, so that the time made was a great surprise to everybody. The horses were matched to go opposite ways of the track, Kirkman to have the pole for the first five miles, the mare the second five, and so on alternately.

Promptly at three o'clock the word was given, and away they went; passing each other for the first time, near the quarter pole, the horse had the lead a couple of lengths, maintaining it to the end of the mile, which was reached in 3:21. The second mile was done in 3:32; and the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth miles were respectively accomplished in 3:11, 3:07, 3:11, and 3:12.

The mare was sponged off at the close of the 5th mile, and came along quite fresh again, while the horse, who had been sweating freely, had the benefit of the same process, with the addition of a scrape, before reaching the end of the sixth. When the seventh mile began, with the mare several lengths in the front, many thought she might become the winner; but when it reached the eighth mile had been gone over, each in 3:15, and when the ninth and tenth miles were finished in 3:11 and 3:10, making half the distance in 32m. 27s., the horse was having his old lead of two or three lengths, and going easily, the result of the race came almost a foregone conclusion. The next two miles were trotted in 3:13 and 3:14, both horses getting a good sponge; the last quarter of the twelfth. The third mile showed the horse driving at a steady pace, and a fresh start.
