1	FOREWORD	12
1	Following government expenditure reductions, the 1984/85 budget level of \$11,294,000 fell in 1985/86 to \$8,687,000. This base cut of \$2.6 million (23%) is not however the only factor contributing to the reductions in 1985/86, the government freeze in February 1986 diminished our level of activities by a further \$787,198. A comparison of expenditure figures for 1985/86 (\$8,039,263) and 1984/85 (\$11,367,108) leaves us with a global reduction of \$3,317,947 (or 29.9%) in expenditures for the International Cultural Relations program (I.C.R.). Therefore in 1985/86 the level of activity has dropped approximately to that which existed five years ago.	12
1	The statistical summary of international cultural activities for the year which follows provides, through a series of graphs and numerical tables, a picture of the quality and diversity of the Bureau's activities, as well as the distribution of expenditures by geographic region. This year we have added a detailed list of activities which make up the Arts Promotion Program; this list can be found in Chapter Eleven.	12
