

## **UNEMPLOYMENT RATES 1993-95**

Over the past three years, Canada, the United States and the United Kingdom have made clear progress in reducing their rates of unemployment: each has brought its rate down by about two percentage points. Further progress in Canada will depend on Canada's commitment to take measures that will increase the flexibility of labour markets, help individuals upgrade their skills, and make reforms that unleash the innovative potential of the private sector.
