## SCHEDULE "C"

## Responsibilities, duties and obligations of Dahomey, Upper Volta, Mali, Niger and Senegal

1. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, Dahomey, Upper Volta, Mali, Niger and Senegal shall carry out the following work and shall supply the following goods and services, at their expense, in respect of the portions of the project located in their respective territories:

- (a) purchase of the sites required for the project;
- (b) the preparation of the sites on which the pylons, towers, structures, international telephone switching centres and other installations will be built as required for the execution of the project in accordance with the plans and specifications of the Canadian consulting engineers;
- (c) the construction of access roads to the sites of the various pylons, towers, structures, international telephone switching centres and other installations required for the execution of the project in accordance with the plans and specifications of the Canadian consulting engineers, prepared in cooperation with the appropriate local services; and
- (d) the local labour force required for the goods and services listed in the above paragraphs and payments of this labour force; and
- (e) all other work, goods and services, which, in the opinion of the Canadian consulting engineers, can be efficiently carried out, supplied or rendered for the execution of the project by the participating African countries, in so far as the latter are capable of providing them.

  - (a) shall take all necessary steps to facilitate the rapid clearance of equipment, goods, products and supplies from Canada or any other country which are necessary for the execution of the portion of the project located in their respective territories, without fees, customs duties, or other import or inspection taxes;
  - (b) shall exempt the Canadian contractors and their employees, agents and foreign subcontractors involved in the execution of the project, and their dependants, from all categories of taxes, resident taxes or other taxes levied upon income, fees, allowances and any other remuneration from Canada or from any other country, and shall also exempt them from the obligation to submit written declarations regarding the above-mentioned exemptions, provided such contractors and other persons are subject to the taxation system of their country of origin;
  - (c) shall exempt the Canadian contractors and their employees, agents and foreign subcontractors involved in the execution of the project, and their dependants, from all duties and taxes on imported equipment and supplies, furniture, personal objects and effects (including medication), provided they import these articles personally or buy them in the foreign country within six months of arriving. The above-mentioned persons shall also be allowed duty-free entry for their technical and professional equipment or for their automobiles (one vehicle per officer or family). Such effects, equipment or other objects shall not be disposed of in any way in Dahomey, Upper Volta, Mali, Niger or Senegal; if they are, they shall be subject to the duties and taxes levied by these countries;
