

The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44:—

By Mr. Blair:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. What sums have been paid Peter White, K.C., or his partners, by the Federal Government, for professional services, since 1925, to date.

2. In what cases or what services he rendered for the Government of Canada during the above period.

3. How much he charged each day and on what days he performed services, and what his expense charges were since 1925, to date, to the Government of Canada; (b) in each case; (c) per day; (d) on what days and dates.

By Mr. Pouliot:—Order of the House for a Return showing: (a) the number, (b) the total cost of investigations for political partisanship undertaken by each department in each province since the month of August, 1930.

By Mr. Duguay:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. Number of emigrants of Mozaic or Hebrew faith entered Canada between 1921 and 1930.

2. On what grounds and upon what conditions these emigrants entered the country.

3. In what localities the emigrants of Mozaic or Hebrew faith who entered the country as settlers are established.

The following Order of the House was issued to the proper officer:—

By Mr. Marcil, for Mr. Girouard:—Order of the House for a copy of all telegrams, letters, correspondence and other documents, relating to the inquiry into the conduct of the postmaster at St. Felicien, Quebec. Also a copy of the report made by the investigator.

The Bill No. 8, An Act respecting a certain Trade Agreement between His Majesty's Government in Canada and His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, was again considered in Committee of the Whole, and further progress having been made and reported, the Committee obtained leave to consider it again at the next sitting of the House.

Bill No. 7, An Act to amend the Excise Act.

Bill No. 9, An Act to amend The Canada Grain Act (Domestic grain).
