

fair—that I had treated the increase in the equalization payments as though it were nothing. That, sir, is not true. I have welcomed them every time they have been introduced, and I have always given this government credit for doing it.

Mr. Fleming (Eglinton): On the question of privilege, sir; the hon. member has, it is quite true, allowed himself generously, graciously, condescendingly, to speak well of the action of the government in providing the Atlantic provinces adjustment grant, but he has always poured ridicule on and he has always minimized the increase that the present government has made in the provincial share of the yield from the personal income tax. It was for this reason I gave those very substantial figures in the course of my remarks tonight. So, what looks to him like a very, very small change in the St. Laurent formula, has meant about \$190 million to the provinces in these last three years.

Mr. Pickersgill: The record speaks for itself.
