Legislative Program

I should like to point out, however, that one of the understandings was that certain commitments that the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development (Mr. Chrétien) made to the committee that dealt with the bill last session would be implemented. The one that is of particular interest and which was spelled out in the committee was that at the appropriate stage, either at the report stage or at third reading, there would be agreement to the presentation of an amendment which would have the effect of deleting from section 6 of the National Parks Act the reference to the expropriation of the lands of Indians.

I might say, Mr. Speaker, that this has been fully discussed and agreed to by those who are interested and concerned. It was felt, however, that the agreement should be on the record at this point. On that basis we are prepared to support this motion.

Mr. Speaker: The House has heard the motion. Is it the pleasure of the House to adopt the said motion?

Motion agreed to.
