Since January 1, 1978, were studies made by the Treasury Board regarding the cost of continuing the full pension to the widow of the recipient of a public service pension?

Mr. Robert Daudlin (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Treasury Board): No studies regarding the cost of continuing the full pension to the widow of the recipient of a public service pension have been completed since January 1, 1978. However, all aspects of survivors' benefits including their costs are now being reviewed in light of the recently promulgated regulations to the Human Rights Act as they relate to employee benefit plans.
