greatest measure of safety to the Public, without curtailing the facilities

requisite for the encouragementand extension of Trade.

We thank Your Excellency for the confidence with which you have committed to our deliberate judgment, the variety of topics you have enumerated as being of moment, and pressing for decision within the limits of the Session; and we unite with Your Excellency in earnestly hoping that a blessing may attend our counsels and enable us to discharge, with dignity and effect, the great trust to which the order of Providence has called us.

Which said Address being read by the Clerk, was unanimously agreed to Ordered, That the said Address be engrossed, and that the same be signed by the Honorable the Speaker.

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor

General by those Members of this House who are Members of the Privy Council.
