

**GALT AUTUMN FAIR
EXCEEDS AVERAGE**

**Live Stock Entries Surpassed
Those of Former Exhibitions—Other Features.**

GALT, Ont., Oct. 2.—With ideal weather to favor the event, about 4000 people attended the second day of the annual fall fair of the South Waterloo Agricultural Society this afternoon in Dickson Park. Live stock entries exceeded former years and the cattle classes developed especially keen competition. In the ring all the classes brought a large entry list, the farmers showing considerable interest in the events for drivers and agricultural horses. A baby show proved an interesting feature of the program, 43 competing for the prizes. Speeding events added excitement to the afternoon's proceedings.
J. Lockie Wilson, superintendent of fairs, was among the visitors and expressed himself as well satisfied with the Galt show, stating that the quality of the entries was above the average. F. C. Hart of the co-operative branch of the department of agriculture was also present.

**LIEUT. NAYLOR-LEYLAND
SUCCEEDS TO INJURIES**

LONDON, Oct. 2, 10:40 p.m.—Lieut. G. V. Naylor-Leyland of the Royal Horse Guards, second son of the late Sir Herbert Naylor-Leyland, whose wife was Miss Jeanie Chamberlain of Cleveland, O., who was previously reported as having been wounded, has succumbed to his injuries.
