

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL O¹⁴.

An Act for the relief of Jacques Demers.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Jacques Demers, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Rouyn, in the province of Quebec, has by his petition alleged that on the fourth day of October, A.D. 1947, at the city of Montreal, in the said province, he and Gabrielle Cholette, who was then of the said city of Montreal, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Jacques Demers and Gabrielle Cholette, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Jacques Demers may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Gabrielle Cholette had not been solemnized.
