

tion Acts of British Columbia and Alberta, the Company will, at all times, deliver an adequate supply of suitable timber, rails, ties, planks, and sheet iron, at the nearest cross cut to the face of all raise workings, and in places where the regular pit cars go to the working face, without being handled by the Miner, they shall be delivered on the cars to the working face; in other places across the pitch, the timber, rails, ties, planks and sheet iron, will be delivered at the mouth of the room.

LOADING OF COAL FROM CHUTES.

In pitching seams, where chutes are used, the Company will handle all coal placed in the chutes by the Miners.

DOCTOR AND HOSPITAL ARRANGEMENTS.

The matter of Doctor and Hospital arrangements, is to be arranged between the employees and the management, and when so arranged, the Company agree to make the collection for that purpose; this is subject, in British Columbia, to the laws of the Province.

In camps where Doctor and Hospital arrangements have already been made, and are satisfactory, the customs prevailing in such camps shall continue.

In the making of any new arrangements for a Doctor, a Committee of three representing the Local Union, and the Manager, representing the Company, shall meet and mutually agree upon a Doctor, and after the Doctor has been selected, the Committee, the Management
