any of the animals dependent on him, are miserable from hunger or exposure; but let every individual of his flocks and herds, receive the full care and attention requisite to their comfort and enjoyment, and a consciousness of this will enable the owner to rest quietly on his pillow, though the storm may howl and rage around. A test of good management is well exhibited in the manner a farmer carries his stock through the winter—when an animal is kept comfortable, it keeps fat; when it suffers, flesh wastes. If an animal shivers in the cold, shelter it in stables or sheds; if damp and dirt annoys it, curry it and give it clean litter. Besides the cutting and collecting wood and timber, and other business usually done in the winter, the farmer may do much in this season, towards forwarding the labors of spring.
