A test of good management is well exhibited in the manner a farmer carries his stock through the winter—when an animal is kept comfortable, it keeps fat; when it suffers, flesh It an animal shivers in the cold, shelter it in stables or sheds; if damp and dirt annoys it, curry it and give it clean litter. Besides the cutting and collecting wood and timber, and other business usually done in the winter, the farmer may do much in this season, towards forwarding the labors of spring.
