

# IMPORTANT NEW BOOKS.

**Treitschke: His Life and Works.** Demy 8vo, cloth, with Frontispiece, 7/6 net.

Treitschke is here presented in English for the first time. The volume contains a selection from his writings, chosen chiefly with a view to representing his general attitude in relation to the present situation. Professor Adolf Hausrath's biography of Treitschke is included, with the object of furnishing an insight to the private life of the man. Among the essays here given are "First Attempts at Colonization," "The Army," "Austria and the German Empire," "Germany and the Neutral States," and "Freedom."

**Germany, France, and Islam.** By HEINRICH VON TREITSCHKE. Demy 8vo, cloth, 7/6 net.

The vital question of Alsace-Lorraine is dealt with at some length, and the German point of view in regard to Turkey and the Orient is made clear in two powerful essays. The lengthy essay under the title of "What we demand from France" is considered by many authorities to be Treitschke's most successful work.

**Bismarck's Letters to his Wife from the Seat of War, 1870-71.** Demy 8vo, cloth, gilt top, with Frontispiece in photogravure, 3/6 net.

These letters were first published in Berlin in 1903, and although an American edition was circulated in the following year (now out of print), no edition has hitherto been issued in this country. The letters, apart from their psychological interest, have, in regard to the 1870 campaign, an historical value of no small importance.
