If that be not so, then there must be an exception to the general rule, which we were told the other day was not disputed, that anything which was not committed to the province was committed by section 91 to the Dominion. SIR ROBERT FINLAY: Our position with regard to this question is this, that we have the power and do not want this license.

THE LORD CHANCELLOR: You say the question does not arise. SIR ROBERT FINLAY: Yes, my Lord.

VISCOUNT HALDANE: It might arise, I suppose, where a provincial company was so limited that it could not accept it. SIR ROBERT FINLAY: What I submit upon that is that it shows the extreme inexpediency of answering that question.

VISCOUNT HALDANE: And you are not that company. SIR ROBERT FINLAY: No, my Lord.
