North Bay, Nov. 6.—Word has been received of a double drowning accident between Mink Island fishing station and Limestone Islands. The victims were both young men, one being Thos. McDevitt of Parry Sound and the other John Waiton of Collingwood. The young men went out in a small sloop called a shoal boat, to lift some nets. Not returning, search was made, which resultd in finding the boat, oars and nets. Parties are still dragging for the bodies. It is supposed the boat was over-loaded and was swamped, and that the boys, who were good swimmers, at tempted to swim to the nearest land and were drowned.
