UNDERGOES AN OPERATION. Special Committee to Deal With Salary Increases Succeeds in Not Meeting.

Hamilton, July 6.—(Special).—Ald. Findlay was around town as usual yesterday. Last night he was seized with severe pains and the doctors diagnosed his case as one of appendicitis. He was taken to the City Hospital this morning, and this afternoon an operation was performed by Drs. McNichol, Gilley and Cockburn. They found the appendix to be very much diseased, and some of his intestines gangrenous. While the doctors say the operation was successful they state that Ald. Findlay's condition is critical.
