ARGUED OVER LAND SALE  
AND ONE MAN IS SHOT

Bullet Goes Thru Frank Ember's  
Left Ear and Enters Head—  
John Woodward Accused.

Frank R. Ember, 40 years old, living  
at 19 DuVernet-avenue, was shot on last  
night at 10:40 o'clock, during an alterca-  
tion, the cause of which is unknown.

Woodward, who lives at 75 Kent-  
north-avenue, called at Ember's house  
for a party which he was entitled to  
collect as a real estate agent in the em-  
ploy of Maclean & Co. Ember had signed  
certain documents of sale, and it was  
during an argument that he was shot.

Ember, who was upstairs, heard  
the shots, and coming down, met Wood-  
ward, who pointed a revolver at his  
head, and he screamed for help aroused  
Harry Wilson, who was in the vicinity.

They rushed into the house and  
overpowered Woodward, and called to  
a woman who was passing to call the  
East Toronto Police Station by tele-  
phone. Sgt. Galt and Policeman  
Grant (284) responded.

Woodward was under the influence  
of intoxicants, and Sgt. Galt, who  
was to take a statement from him.  
Mrs. Ember, when asked regarding the  
cause of the trouble, which is unknown,  
said she was passing to call the  
East Toronto Police Station by tele-  
phone, and was attended by Dr. A. F. Denary, 10  
Lull-avenue.

Dr. A. F. Denary told The World  
that he had found Ember suffering  
from a bullet which had entered at  
his left ear and lodged in his neck.  
Ember made a statement to the ef-  
fect that Woodward had called upon  
him regarding the placing of a sign  
on the land that he had for sale. An  
argument had started and then Wood-  
ward drew a gun, and Ember, clinch-  
ing with Woodward and the weapon was  
discharged. Ember is an Englishman,  
who resided in East Toronto for  
some time. He is a carpenter by  
trade and has been married about  
seven years. He has a son nearly  
five years old.

Ember was taken to the General Hospi-  
tal in Cobbleville ambulance, where  
he had just recovered consciousness at  
an early hour this morning, and it is  
expected he will recover from his  
wounds.

Woodward is a little man, being only  
about 5 feet 3 inches in height.

JURY NAMES VENTRICINE  
AS SLAYER OF FABBIO

Evidence Shows That Murderer  
Had Been Knocked Into Ditch  
By Third Party.

Chief Coroner Johnson's jury found  
a verdict of murder against Pasquale  
Ventricine at the inquest held at the  
morgue last night into the death of  
Rafaele Fabbio, who was stabbed Sun-  
day night.

From the evidence it would appear  
that Ventricine, who had been struck  
by Tony Bush, because he had in-  
sulted Bush's sister, rose from the  
roadway and struck out at the man  
whom he found beside him. This  
chanced to be Fabbio, instead of Tony,  
who had been taken away by his  
sister.

Bush was the first witness called  
and enlarged upon his story told im-  
mediately after the crime. He de-  
clared, speaking partly thru Court In-  
terpreter Frank Motta and partly in En-  
glish, that the prisoner had come to his  
house at 239 Manning-avenue at about  
8:30 Sunday night. Pasquale had asked  
for him (Tony) and he had gone  
out with him. They walked north on  
Manning-avenue, when the prisoner had  
said it was light and they then turned  
and walked south. When they re-  
passed the house, there were three or  
four of the other men of the door.

Origin of Row.  
Pasquale was drunk. Tony had been  
drinking. At last when they reached a  
point 100 feet south of the house Tony  
turned to leave the other man. Later
