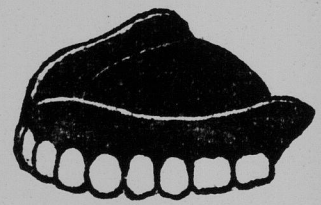

The Times has received a copy of a new piece of music, The Currier Business University Two-Step, composed by Byron C. Tapley, and dedicated to the students.

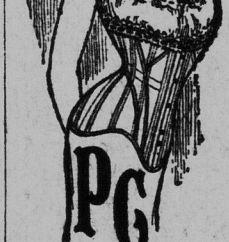
