# TO EXECUTE

Government in Difficulty Because of Capital Punishment Edict

Petrograd, Sept. 14.—The question of the probable fate of General Korniloff is exciting public opinion. Indications are that the government must face serious difficulties over the matter.

A feature is the creditable absence of bitter feeling and clamor for vengeance. Having re-established capital punishment at the front, however, the government, if it spares the rebel commander. must face the reproach that it executed common soldiers for less serious offences and it would be virtually impossible to impose the death penalty in the future. Against this are the facts of General Korniloff's brilliant services, his chivalrous and personal character and the happy circumstances that there has been no bloodshed so far.

There are indications that the govern-

nent is seeking a way out. As an instance, M. Kishkin, the new minister of the interior, declares that the government has decided not to take extreme measures against Korniloff, as it does not want to appear revengeful. "The story," M. Kishkin said, "is so tangled that only an inquiry by a com-mission can elucidate the truth. Mean time we have reason to believe that the revolt was due to a misunderstanding S. V. Ladmir Lvoff, who has not the reputation of being a responsible man."
