**Risked His Life
To Save a Boy**
William Oliver's Gallantry Stood
Between Little Ronald Mc-
Gorman and Death

William Oliver made a heroic rescue
yesterday afternoon when, clad in his
heavy working clothes he leaped over
the wharf of the Eastern Steamship
Company and rescued Ronald McGor-
man, who was going down for the last
time. Mr. Oliver was forced to swim
several feet, but succeeded in holding the
boy out of the water until a rope was
lowered.

Young McGorman, who is fourteen
years old, was playing with another
companion near the edge of the pier
when he fell over.

Mr. Oliver, who is a driver for W. H.
Cole Ltd., Water street, was nearby and
without any hesitation, plunged into the
chilly water and just reached the boy
in time to save his life. It was gal-
lant act for which the rescuer deserves
no ordinary recognition.

**SIXTY YEARS AGO FIRST
TRAIN TRIP BETWEEN
MONTREAL AND TORONTO**

Moncton, Oct. 28.—Yesterday was
the sixtieth anniversary of the inaugura-
tion of railroad communication between
Montreal and Toronto. On October 27,
1856, the Grand Trunk operated its first
through train between those two im-
portant Canadian centres.

Five months after the opening of the
road night trains were added to the
schedule and railway history gives many
complimentary accounts of the excel-
lence of the accommodation provided.
The first sleeping coach ever made for
any railroad in the world was built at
Hamilton, Ont.

in the fact that it has led the way in

buted to the National Allied Bazaar, by a

her name made public. It will be placed

necklace was brought by its owner to
the office of Mrs. Charles Allen Porter
at 42 Trinity place.

"Please accept this little gift as my
contribution to relieve the suffering in
Europe," said the benefactor. "I have
much sympathy for the cause of the
Allies and the suffering in those coun-
tries, and wish to do my share in help-
ing." Then she laid a box on Mrs. Por-
ter's desk and departed.

Not until the box was opened did Mrs.
Porter know what had been contributed.
She placed the necklace in the hands of
an expert who pronounced the pearls to
be of the purest quality, worth more
than \$10,000. They are now in a safe
deposit vault where they will remain
until placed on exhibit and on sale at
the bazaar.
