SCOUT BADGE IS ADDRESS SUBJECT

TEXAS AWAITS MURDER TRIAL OF FT. WORTH PASTOR



All Texas, as well as neighboring states, are interested in the murder trial of the Rev. J. Frank Norris, Ft. Worth pastor, who goes on trial Nov. 1, for the murder of D. E. Chipp, wealthy lumberman. Chipp was shot down as he entered Rev. Norris' study to protest against some of the pulpit preachings of the minister. Accompanying photo shows the First Baptist church of Ft. Worth, where Rev. Norris was the pastor. Judge Hoseney will hear the case. Mrs. Chipp, widow of the victim, and Mrs. Norris, wife of Rev. Norris, both will be important witnesses.

THE SCOUT BADGE

District Scoutmaster O. J. Lawson writes:

"Scouts, let us deal for a moment with our Scout badge, which is the arrow head that shows the North on a map or on a compass, and to you Scouts it means that you must show the way in doing your duty and helping others. If you notice on your badge, the scroll is turned up at the ends like a Scout's mouth, because he does his duty with a smile and willingness. The knot is to remind the Scout to do a good turn to someone daily. 'The meaning of our motto, 'Be Prepared,' is that a Scout must prepare himself, by previous thinking out and practising, how to act in any accidents or emergencies, so that he is never taken by surprise, and he knows exactly what to do when anything unexpected happens. To carry out these duties and the work to be done a Scout must be strong, healthy and active, and he can only make himself so by taking a little care about himself.

"In closing, I might say, boys, to be a Scout our honor must be sacred; we must be loyal to God, be courteous and polite to all women, children and infirm persons, be helpful to everybody and help the poor whenever we can. I believe that before a boy enters a troop, the scoutmaster should test that boy and see that he knows the meaning of a Scout. Next week I shall speak on 'Patriotism'."

BADGE REQUIREMENTS

Qualifications for the Pathfinder Proficiency Badge are: Have an intimate knowledge of the locality round his troop headquarters, including fire alarm boxes, hydrants, fire and police stations; general hospital, post and telegraph offices and telephone exchanges, railway stations, street car routes and six doctors (three nearest troop headquarters and three nearest home); schools and churches, factories, livery stables, motor garages, principal food and provision merchants, and taxi stands and cycle repairers.

FREDERICTON, Oct. 29.—Three arrests have been made by the police tonight in connection with the burglary of four coats from the store of J. Clark & Sons, Ltd., last night.
