

CLIMBS HIGH WITH START OF 35 CENTS DAY

Geo. H. Jones Made Chairman of Standard Oil of New Jersey

FIRST OFFICE JOB WAS AT \$3 WEEK

New Head Reaches Lofty Position at 53 After 35 Years

NEW YORK, Nov. 26.—George H. Jones, who quit school upon finishing the grammar grades to become a factory wage earner, was this week elected chairman of the board of the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey, key-stone of the far-flung interests of the world's greatest industrial enterprises. He succeeds the late A. C. Bedford, Walter C. Teague, president and chief executive officer of the company, who was in line for the chairmanship, preferred to remain in his present position, according to an announcement from the company's offices.

The elevation of Mr. Jones to the chairmanship bears out an old Standard Oil tradition, that the door to the highest positions opens only from within. It has taken the new chairman more than 35 years to advance from a job as stenographer in one of the Standard Oil subsidiaries through gradual stages to his present responsibilities.

Mr. Jones, the son of a carpenter, was born in Carthage, N. Y., where his mother is still living. He is 53 years old. He went through the grammar school by using the textbooks of a playmate, his own family being too poor to supply him with books. His first employment after finishing grammar school, was in a chair factory. Later he worked in a knitting mill, where his daily wage was 35 cents.

Further attendance at school denied him, he entered an insurance office as a sales boy, at \$3 a week. With \$40 saved, he arranged to enter a business school at Oswego. His anxiety to learn quickly caused his eyes to fail after three weeks. The principal of the business school sent him out as a typewriter salesman. Convinced eventually that he was a failure as a salesman, he asked his father for advice as to what he should do. His connection with the Standard Oil began at that time. The National Trust Company of Oil City, Pa., a subsidiary, had sent a call to the Oswego school for a stenographer. The pay was \$30 a month. George H. Jones got the job.

STUDIED LAW AT NIGHT. He studied law at night, receiving occasional assistance from M. F. Elliott, who was later to become general counsel of the Standard Oil Company, in New York. In 1897 he was transferred to New York as secretary to Daniel O'Day, a well-known Standard Oil official. In this position Mr. Jones made with his own hands maps and charts of every pipe line in the country, showing the location and capacity of every pumping station. Later he familiarized himself with the details of the natural gas properties in the same way.

FOLEY EXONERATED

Naval Court Clears Him of Charge of Attempt to Sway Testimony

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—Captain Paul Foley was exonerated today by the Shenandoah naval court of inquiry, of Mrs. Margaret Ross Landowne's charge that he sought to sway her testimony. The court held that Captain Foley, its former judge advocate, was not guilty either of seeking to cause false testimony to be offered before the court, or of seeking by "improper means to influence" the widow of the Shenandoah's commander.

EXPECT CANADA TO QUIT CABLE BOARD

Australian Government Officials Believe Dominion Will Carry Out Threat

MELBOURNE, Nov. 26.—In government circles here, it is expected that the Canadian government will carry out its threat to withdraw from partnership in the Pacific Cable Board.

A Canadian Press cable from London stated that the Daily Express understands Hon. Charles Murphy, Postmaster General for Canada, has recommended withdrawal from the partnership on the ground, among other things, that duplication of the cable from Banfield, Vancouver, to Fiji, was decided upon in the absence of Canadian representatives and the contracts therefor were awarded despite Canada's protests and in defiance of the provisions of the Imperial Cable Act under which unanimity in such matters is essential.

NEW RECORD ESTABLISHED.

TORONTO, Ont. Nov. 26.—Clair Foster, operating a small home made radio transmitting station at Port Alberni, British Columbia, established a new world's record, according to information received here today, when he communicated across the Pacific and over 1,000 miles of Australia, while more than a quarter of the distance was in daylight.

It is well known in radio circles that daylight transmission is very much more difficult than night, and that sending over the sunset or sunrise line offers still greater obstacles to the travel of radio waves.

The most remarkable feature of Mr. Foster's record, however, is the extremely small power used by his transmitter. Instead of transmitting vacuum tube, powered with ordinary receiving tube, powered with heavy duty "B" batteries intended for reception purposes. The total power required by the Foster transmitter in establishing this trans-Pacific record was only 18 watts, a fraction of the power used by the ordinary electric light bulb. Electric flatrons, for instance, usually use about 250 watts.

Radio experts, in discussing this record, ascribe the efficiency of Foster's transmitter to the steady unvarying signals which it emits. The usual amateur transmitter draws its power from alternating current mains causing a hum which detracts from the steadiness of the signals. By using batteries, Foster has eliminated this difficulty.

Backs Auto Down Elevator Shaft

TORONTO, Nov. 26.—When his motor car dropped 20 feet down an elevator shaft in the garage of the Toronto post office late last evening, Bert Drake, aged 40 years, sustained three fractured ribs and possibly internal injuries. He is in a serious condition. It was Drake's custom to lower his car to the basement every evening. Last night he backed the car to the elevator shaft and evidently thought the elevator was in position.

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20,000 Tons of Coal Go Down in Vessel

The fire was finally brought under control. One fire fighter was killed when a wall collapsed, and several others were injured. The damages have not been estimated.

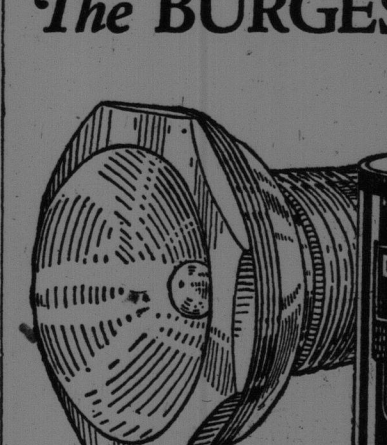

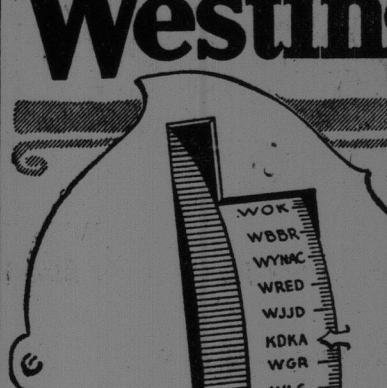
