PADDOCK EXPRESSES HIS DISAPPOINTMENT

Honestly Believes He Made Records Rejected by A. A. U.—Suggests Need of New Watches. Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 25.—Charles W. Paddock of Pasadena, in a statement published by The Los Angeles Times, told of his disappointment at the failure of the A. A. U. officials to accept five sprinting records credited to him, after a track meet at Santa Barbara, Cal., July 4, last, and suggested the need of new stop watches to register in tenths of seconds rather than in fifths.

"I honestly believe I made the records and that the timing was as accurate as could be done with the ordinary fifth-of-a-second stop watch," said Paddock. "The average stop watch hand," he continued, "does not necessarily stop on the exact fifth, but may be just a half-over or under the exact fifth. This is what gives rise to the frequent statement that 'so and so ran a slow ten' or 'so and so ran a slow ten and a half' in other words, so and so is just enough slower than ten seconds flat so that the hand shows a half slower than an even ten seconds, but not far enough over to call it 10-1-5."

"In the same manner there are lots of sprinters who have consistently shaded ten seconds for the 100, but never have been nearer the ten-second mark than 9-4-5."

FINDS ONE MAN IN EVERY TEN A COUNTER JUMPER

A Retail Store for Every 40 Families, Says W. G. Shepherd.

One Seller for Three Families—More Men Retailing Goods Than the Total Transportation Personnel, Says Speaker.

Atlantic City, N. J., Nov. 25.—America is "a nation of counter jumpers," according to William G. Shepherd of Collier's Weekly, who addressed the annual convention of the Association of National Advertisers in session here.

"The man power of the United States is about 80,000,000, and 10 per cent of this is behind counters," said Mr. Shepherd. "Nearly two thirds of the 8,000,000 men and women behind counters are engaged in selling food and clothing. For every three farmers in the United States there is some one behind a counter. For every four workmen in the factories of the United States there is a store clerk or a store manager or a store owner waiting to sell what the workmen produce."

"We think we have a lot of railroad men in the United States. We have, but it takes as many store clerks standing behind counters to sell goods to us as it does men to carry these goods in transportation, to keep the railroads in repair and to keep the rolling stock in good condition."

"For every forty families in the United States there is a retail store. Struggling under this heavy burden that the job cannot be done by having only one of the family at work. There are 24,000,000 families in the United States, while almost 42,000,000 men, women and children work for wages or salaries. Causes figures indicate that at least one member of the family must assist Dad in keeping the retail store in his community alive, and that, he doesn't do it."
