KILLED 47 IN 1921.

The automobile fatality record for the city of Toronto for the year 1921 shows a marked improvement over 1920 and over 1919 as well.

The Safety League figures show a total of 47 motor deaths in Toronto in 1921. This is just twenty less than in 1920, and is three less than in 1919. This decrease in accidents is not due to a decrease in the number of motor cars in Toronto, as there were thousands more automobiles registered in 1921 than in 1920.
