MAY MEAN HIGHER RAILROAD RATES

This or Additional Congressional Appropriation—Early Action to Settle Men's Demands

Washington, Aug. 21—Early action to settle unrest in the ranks of railroad employees who have been demanding new wage increases was forecast yesterday.

After a lengthy conference with representatives of the shop crafts, Director-General Hines went to the White House to discuss with President Wilson the problems facing the railroad administration.

While no announcement was made it was understood that the entire question was reviewed, including the obvious necessity for an increase in rates or another congressional appropri-

ation to provide funds for any wage advance that may be made, since the administration has been incurring a deficit every month this year due to the falling off in business and the higher cost of labor and materials.

Mr. Hines promised the shopmen's leaders that he would give careful consideration to all the facts presented and would endeavor to reach a final decision in the near future, indicating that he will order into effect any changes in the wage scale without referring the demands to a board of investigation.
