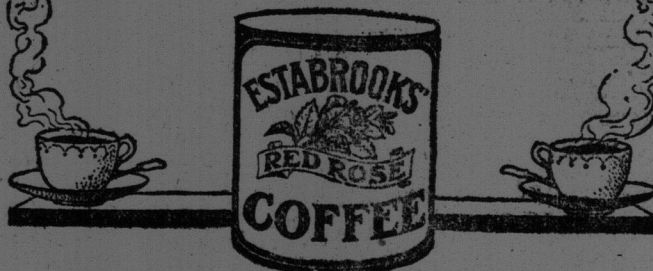

## OPERA COMPANY SCORES SUCCESS

The Chocolate Soldier a Fine Production Splendidly Presented—Talented Principals, Strong Chorus and Excellent Orchestra Win Instant Favor at Opera House

Much was expected by the large audience which filled the Opera House last evening for the opening performance of The Chocolate Soldier by the Whitney Opera Company and their expectations were fully realized. The production, which is based on George Bernard Shaw's "Arms and the Man," and set to music by Oscar Straus, is one of the finest examples of modern light opera. The music is of a very high character and the more popular numbers which were already known to the audience were received with especial favor. The opera was presented by a company of artists each of whom shone in his or her particular role, making the production an exceptionally well balanced one. The principals are assisted by a splendid chorus of excellent voices regarding which the only complaint that could be made is that the chorus is not given greater opportunity to display its abilities. The special orchestra, led by Sig. A. deNovellis, which is carried by the company also added greatly to the success of the production. The scenery, stage settings and costumes are rich and attractive and combine in forming striking stage pictures.
